

Tips for sharing books with 4 & 5 year olds

Sound Sensitivity helps children think about how letters and their sounds work.

Encourage children to play with sounds and letters.

guess how stories work. Ask, "What do you think happens next?"

Knowing Letters is important to be ready to read. Help children learn both CAPITAL and

lowercase letters.

Rhyming is a way children learn that words are made up of smaller parts. This helps when they later try to sound out words to read. Songs also help children hear words broken down into parts.

Look for books with rhymes and songs.

Repetition helps children learn how stories work. These books also help children to tell part of the story.

Narrative Skills and

Summarizing help children understand stories. Once children are familiar with a story, ask them to tell you what happens in the book. Be encouraging and make it fun!
